9. <u>2021 DOMINION MEMBER SPORTS CHAMPIONSHIPS</u>

Dominion policy is to normally hold the Dominion Member Sports Championships in the following timeframes:

- i. Cribbage: Friday 23 April Monday 26 Apr 2021 (Friday and Monday being arrival and departure days respectively).
- ii. Darts: Friday 30 April Monday 3 May 2021 (Friday and Monday being arrival and departure days respectively).
- ii. Eight Ball: Friday 28 May Monday 31 May 2021 (Friday and Monday being arrival and departure days respectively).

MOTION: That the preceding dates for 2021 be approved for the member sports listed.

CARRIED

A call for hosting applications will go out from Dominion Command to all Provincial Commands in early 2019. The deadline for submissions to Dominion Command will be 31 August 2019.

In response to a suggestion from Alberta/Northwest Territories Command in which Commands only submit one application per member sports championship, the committee decided to maintain the current process where all applications be submitted to Dominion Command for consideration.

10. <u>DOMINION MEMBER SPORTS CHAMPIONSHIPS GENERAL</u>

The following items brought forward to the Dominion Command Sports Committee were discussed:

- a. Due to budgetary reasons, the committee declined paying for assigned seats for the Provincial teams when flying for Dominion Member Sports Championships.
- b. Due to budgetary reasons, the committee did not support the recommendation to increase the \$700 flight cost cap.
- c. The committee considered having eight ball follow the same rules as cribbage and darts where all members of the team must be from the same branch within the Command they represent. However, since three Commands are already not participating in eight ball, the committee does not want to create an additional barrier when their focus is on increasing participation.
- d. Based on the hosting applications received for the Dominion Eight Ball Championships, the committee will consider favouring branches with three or more 7 or 8 foot tables.
- e. The committee will consider asking host branches to submit photos of their eight ball tables to ensure quality for the Dominion Eight Ball Championships.
- f. The committee sports representatives will review at the 2019 events if singles and doubles should be run simultaneously during the Dominion Cribbage and Darts Championships.

11. 2018 LEGION NATIONAL YOUTH TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 42nd Legion National Youth Track and Field Championships took place 8-14 August 2018 in Brandon, Manitoba. The total attendance was 650 athletes, including 317 Legion sponsored athletes, representing all 10 provincial commands, and 333 open category athletes. The athletes were supported by 37 Legion sponsored chaperones and 27 Legion sponsored coaches, as well as 97 open category coaches. There were approximately 2,000 spectators, officials, and volunteers from all parts of Canada in attendance which included veterans, both retired and serving, covering all branches of service.

The program continued to consist of, for Legion athletes, instructional clinics, practice sessions, social activities and the actual meet. For 2018, a remembrance theme of the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War was prominent throughout. As well, the 42nd anniversary of these games was acknowledged.

The President of the Legion, Comrade Dave Flannigan, attended the opening ceremonies and was the official guest of honour. In attendance as well was Mr. Angus Stanfield, Royal Canadian Legion Dominion Vice President and Sports Committee Chair; Ronn Anderson,

Royal Canadian Legion MB/NW ON President; Larry Maguire, MP Brandon-Souris; Reg Helwer, MLA Brandon West; His Worship Rick Chrest, Mayor City of Brandon; Major Howard Nelson, Acting Base Commander CFB Shilo; and Master Warrant Officer Sean David, Acting Base Chief Warrant Officer CFB Shilo. Immediately following the ceremony, Dominion Command hosted a reception on-site at the Brandon Sportsplex. Further receptions were held at Branch #3 Brandon for the chaperones and coaches on Saturday and Sunday respectively. The closing banquet was hosted at Brandon University in the main dining hall on Sunday evening.

From the opening ceremony through to the closing banquet, Canada's contributions to freedom and the sacrifices of our veterans formed the cornerstone of this event. This was projected through the content of speeches, event publications, local and national media outlets, event paraphernalia sporting the 100th anniversary logo (i.e. volunteer t-shirts, event bags, hats, bibs, event booklets, etc.), and formal recognition of veterans who were invited guests to the championships, acted as chaperones, volunteered their services, and formed part of the event medal presenters. Other areas of remembrance were the medals presented which used the Brooding Soldier, the central feature of the Saint Julien Memorial, as the basis for the design, the laying of a wreath by the Dominion Sports Chair, and the two minutes of silence during the opening ceremonies. During the final banquet, the playing of the Battle of the Somme and the Heights of Dargai (both written by pipers that fought in those two battles) and Amazing Grace by the Dominion Sports Chair on his grandfather's (a WWI veteran) bagpipes, which were present at the Battle of Vimy Ridge, was an especially poignant moment.

The meet was held from 10-12 August under very warm weather conditions. The facility at the Brandon Sportsplex was in excellent condition and enhanced the overall competition. The meet itself was carried out over a full three-day period under the excellent organization of the meet director, Jim Murray. Seven meet records and two national records were broken. The top Legion female athlete, receiving the LeRoy Washburn trophy, was Savannah Sutherland from Saskatchewan and the top male athlete, receiving the Jack Stenhouse trophy, was Emanuel Désilets from Quebec. Logistically, the caterer provided good meals on site with a nutritionally designed menu developed in concert with a nutritional sport expert. The quarters used to house the Legion teams were in good condition at Brandon University. Transportation for staff and Legion teams was excellent.

For 2018, an extensive social media campaign was conducted which included Facebook, Instagram and Twitter. Additional promotion prior to the event was provided through advertisements at the OFSAA Track and Field Championships, CFB Shilo's base newspaper, and TV spots on the PBS Station Prairie Public. Extensive coverage of the event was provided by the Brandon Sun prior to, during, and post event. During the games, the event was broadcast via live streaming on AthleticsCanada.TV by ColossoVision. Overall, the live feeds were very well received by the audience with a total of 17,666 views of the track feed and 7,382 views of the field feed.

The Brandon community led by the LAC Chair, Barb Andrews, of Branch #3 and the Vice-

LAC Chair, Jackie Nichol, of Brandon University were instrumental in organizing the event on the ground. The entire Brandon community rallied around the program providing the volunteer base of over 300. CFB Shilo was a strong supporter as well, providing logistical support in the form of modular tenting. The City of Brandon, the Province of Manitoba, Athletics Canada, Athletics Manitoba, and Programmed Insurance Brokers Inc. were additional gold level sponsors, along side 32 other local sponsors, who made the event possible.

12. 2019 LEGION NATIONAL YOUTH TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

- **a.** <u>Event Dates/Location/Update</u> Cape Breton, Nova Scotia will host the 2019 Legion Nationals from 7-13 August 2019. The competition dates are 9-11 August. A preliminary site visit was conducted 3-6 November 2018 and there are no major concerns at this time. There is tremendous support locally and provincially (over the two years, \$100,000 from Cape Breton University, \$100,000 from Cape Breton Regional Municipality and \$90,000 from the Province of Nova Scotia) and the Local Arrangements Committee has been wonderful to work with to date. A follow up site visit will occur in the spring dates to be confirmed.
- **b. Schedule** The first draft of the schedule has been developed as follows:

2019 LEGION NATIONALS SCHEDULE





- **c. Sponsorship** Programmed Insurance Brokers Inc. will continue its \$20,000 sponsorship for 2019. MBNA will again be solicited for sponsorship funding, as will an assortment of Canadian companies including BMO.
- **d.** Remembrance Theme The selected remembrance theme for 2019 is the 75th anniversary of D-Day. An accompanying theme will be Peacekeepers Day (9 August).

- **e.** <u>Invitees</u> The Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia will be invited to attend as the opening ceremony guest of honour. The invitation for a closing banquet guest of honour is still in the planning stages.
- **f.** <u>Event Assistant</u> Interviews for the event assistant will be conducted during the last week of November 2018 and an Algonquin College School of Sports Business Management student will be selected for a 2019 internship. The selected intern will begin the internship with the Legion during the first full week of January 2019.
- **g.** Athletics Canada The partnership between The Royal Canadian Legion and Athletics Canada has been re-established with Athletics Canada providing merchandise and webcast support. In addition, Athletics Canada will provide a technical representative, as well as high performance athlete guest speakers.
- **h.** <u>Head Chaperones</u> Both Helen and John Ladouceur have indicated their willingness to return as head chaperones. It was requested that authorization be given to accept their offer.

MOTION: It was moved that Helen and John Ladouceur be selected as the head chaperones for 2019.

CARRIED

It was also noted that there needs to be succession planning when the current Head Chaperones are no longer in a position to volunteer. As such, consideration needs to be given to qualified replacements and those replacements must be exposed to the duties assigned to these positions.

13. 2021 & 2022 LEGION NATIONAL TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Dominion policy is to normally hold the Legion National Youth Track & Field Championships in the following timeframes which have been approved by the Dominion Command Sports Committee:

- i. 2021: 4-10 August 2021 (competition dates: 6-8 August)
- ii. 2022: 3-9 August 2022 (competition dates: 5-7 August)

A call for hosting applications will go out from Dominion Command to all Provincial Commands and interested municipalities. The document is currently being developed in conjunction with Athletics Canada and will be shared with the Dominion Command Sports Committee prior to general distribution.

14. <u>2019 BUDGET REVIEW</u>

a. <u>2019 Legion National Track & Field Championships Budget</u> – The 2019 Legion Nationals Budget was presented and is attached at Annex "I".

b. <u>2019 Sports Committee Budget</u> – The 2019 Sports Committee Budget was presented and is attached at Annex "J".

15. REGIONAL REPRESENTATION - COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Committee members were requested to make and maintain contact with their associated provincial sports representatives and provide any feedback to the Dominion Command Sports Committee on Provincial Command concerns for both Legion member sports and track and field.

ACTION: Committee Members

16. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

The following new business items were raised:

a. Legion Nationals Age Category Classifications

The age category classifiers midget and youth for the Legion National Youth Track and Field Championships will be replaced with U16 and U18 respectively.

b. <u>Legion Nationals Coaching Certification</u>

As per the Sports Guide, each Provincial Command must name one head coach, and that person has to be a fully certified National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) performance coach. All other team coaches require NCCP club coach certification (there may be exceptions to this rule). At the suggestion of Saskatchewan Command, this requirement will be discussed with the Legion Nationals technical advisor.

ACTION: Committee Secretary

c. <u>Member Sports Volunteer Hours</u>

In response to a question from Nova Scotia/Nunavut Command, branches may opt to institute a required minimum number of volunteer hours in order to qualify for funding to

participate at the National level.

d. <u>Proposed Sports Guide Amendment – Sports Guide 303</u>

The intent of this amendment is to ensure that there is sufficient time to book air travel at a reasonable cost and to ensure that the hotel rooms that are block booked for the Provincial teams are not released. Currently, Provincial Commands are required to complete their Provincial Championships three weeks prior to the Dominion Championships; however, the Sports Committee is recommending to increase this to four weeks. The following recommendation is brought forward for DEC consideration and approval:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that section 303d of the Sports Guide be

amended to read: "Arranging for and regulating Legion Cribbage, Darts and Eight Ball within its jurisdiction and ensuring that Provincial Championships are completed at least *four* weeks prior to the Dominion Championships."

17. NEXT MEETING OF THE DOMINION COMMAND SPORTS COMMITTEE

The next Sports Committee meeting will be scheduled by teleconference. Proposed date will be in April 2019.

18. CLOSING RITUAL AND ADJOURNMENT

The chair concluded the meeting by thanking the committee members for their insight and valued input. The meeting adjourned 24 November 2018 at 1100 hours EST and the chair conducted the closing ritual.

b. <u>2017 Dominion Darts Championship Report</u> – The 2017 Dominion Darts Championship Report was presented and is attached at Annex "C". It was noted that the National Darts Federation of Canada was interested in discussing a possible partnership with the Royal Canadian Legion. This partnership would include the opportunity for the winner of the Legion Championship to be automatically qualified for the Canadian National Adult Darts Championships. The members requested a follow-up with the National Darts Federation of Canada.

- **c.** <u>2017 Dominion Cribbage Championship Report</u> The 2017 Dominion Cribbage Championship Report was presented and is attached at Annex "D".
- **d.** <u>2017 Dominion 8-Ball Championship Report</u> The 2017 Dominion 8-Ball Championship Report was presented and is attached at Annex "E". Three issues were raised from the Championship.
 - i. Number of Commands and number of tables only 7 commands participated. Quebec attempted to hold a Provincial Championship but only had 3 teams interested. With only 7 commands participating, 2 tables is sufficient. However, should there be the full 10 teams, 3 tables is recommended.
 - ii. Single game since there were only 7 commands and in order to allow for more games, the Sports Committee Representative at the Championship changed it from one game per match to two games per match for all round robin play.
 - iii. Ball in hand placement the Tournament Coordinator introduced a rule not outlined in the Dominion Command Sports Guide which stated that once the ball in hand is placed on the table, it must be dragged to not lose contact with the table surface should the player wish to move it. The World Pool-Billiards Association (WPA) rules state that "when the cue ball is in hand, the shooter may place the cue ball anywhere on the playing surface and may continue to move the cue ball until he executes a shot." In the future, the Tournament Coordinator must abide by the WPA rules and Dominion Command must ensure that all parties are aware of these rules.

10. 2017 LEGION NATIONAL YOUTH TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS

a. <u>After-Action Report</u> – The 2017 Legion National Youth Track and Field Championships took place 9 - 15 August in Brandon, MB. The total attendance was 326 Legion sponsored athletes, 35 chaperones and 25 coaches representing all 10 provincial commands. In addition, there were 330 open category athletes and 98 open coaches. There was approximately 5000-6000 spectators/officials/ volunteers from all parts of Canada in attendance over the three days of competition which included veteran's both retired and serving covering all branches of service.

The program continued to consist of, for Legion athletes, instructional clinics, practice sessions, social activities and the actual meet. For 2017 a remembrance theme of the 100th anniversary of the battle of Vimy Ridge was prominent throughout. As well the 41st anniversary of these games was acknowledged.

The Dominion Sports Chairman of the Legion, Comrade Angus Stanfield attended the opening ceremonies and was the official guest of honour. In attendance as well was the MP for Brandon-Souris Larry Maguire, MLA Reg Hewler, mayor of Brandon his Worship Rick Charest, Base Commander for CFB Shilo LCol Dave MacIntyre and Base CWO D.E. Askeland. Immediately following the ceremony Dominion Command hosted a reception on-site at the Brandon Sportsplex Further receptions were held at Branch #04-003 Brandon for the chaperones and coaches on Saturday and Sunday respectively. The closing banquet was hosted at Brandon University in the main dining hall on Sunday evening.

As is the custom within this event the message of veteran recognition and remembrance, which is the perpetual message of the Royal Canadian Legion, was reinforced throughout. This was done through event publications, local and national media outlets, event paraphernalia sporting the 100th anniversary logo (i.e. volunteer t-shirts, event bags, bibs, event booklet, etc.) and

formal recognition of veterans who were invited guests to the games, acted as chaperones, volunteered their services and formed part of the games medal presenters. Other areas of remembrance were the medals presented which used the Vimy Ridge memorial located in France as the basis for the design, the laying of a wreath by the Dominion Sports Chairman and the two minutes of silence during the opening ceremonies. During the final banquet the playing of the Battle of the Somme, Scotland the Brave and Amazing Grace by the Sports Chairman on his grandfather's (a WWI veteran) bagpipes, which were present at the Battle of Vimy Ridge was an especially poignant moment.

The meet was held on 11 - 13 August under perfect weather conditions. The facility at the Brandon Sportsplex was in excellent condition and enhanced the overall competition. In fact the community of Brandon had just invested over a million dollars to upgrade the facility and the Legion Nationals were the first to compete on its surface. The meet itself was carried out over a full three-day period under the excellent organization of the meet director Jim Murray. Nine meet records and four national records were broken. The top Legion female athlete receiving the LeRoy Washburn trophy (for the second time) was Trinity Tutti from ON and the top male athlete receiving the Jack Stenhouse trophy was Jamal Miller from ON as well. Logistically the caterer provided good meals on site with a nutritionally designed menu developed in concert with a nutritional sport expert. The quarters used to house the Legion teams were in good condition. Transportation for staff and Legion teams was excellent.

For 2017 an extensive social media campaign was conducted which included Facebook, Instagram and Facebook live – the latter to broadcast the event to outside audiences. Additional promotion prior to the event was provided through advertisements at the OFSAA T&F Championships, CFB Shilo's and 17 Wing's base newspapers and TV spots on the PBS Station Prairie Public. Extensive coverage of the event was provided by the Brandon Sun prior to, during and post event. During the games, the event was broadcast on Facebook Live and Instagram.

Overall, the live feeds were very well received by the audience with a total of 50,686 views over the three days, 2,497 comments, 3,623 reactions (i.e. likes), and 278 video shares. 176,456 Facebook users also saw the video posts! On average, there were 72 viewers at a time, with the highest number of live views at 139. Once the audience understood what Facebook live was all about, they were extremely receptive and grateful for the opportunity to feel as though they were at the Legion Nationals themselves, cheering on the athletes. Instagram Live does not measure the stats in the same way as Facebook, but after the competition, it was calculated roughly 1,000 total live views over the three days with an average 300 comments per day.

The Brandon community led by the LAC Chairman Barb Andrews of Branch #04-003 and Brandon First CEO Jackie Nichol were instrumental in organizing the event on the ground. The entire Brandon community rallied around the program providing the volunteer base of over 300. CFB Shilo was a strong supporter as well providing logistical support in the form of modular tenting and hosting the Legion athlete contingent on the Monday following the games.

To sum up, I want to convey the importance of this event. It is another of our "Best Kept Secrets" and we must continue to do all we can to get the word out. It is truly life changing for many Canadian Youth. No one else does it and the RCL does it extremely well.

I had a gentleman, an official who officiates all over North America approach me and say every governing body could learn from the Legion - he specifically pointed out the treatment of the coaches and officials. There were many parents and spectators with tears in their eyes

thanking the Legion - "I had no idea the Legion did this!" echoed around the event.

The Legion support staff under the leadership of Danny Martin - Angela Keeling Colkitt, Leroy Washburn, and John and Helen Ladouceur are special individuals; they deserve much of the credit for the success of this event.

As you know, this is not a cheap event to stage and I feel obligated to remark on the financial aspects of it. There is no fat to cut - no fluff. Our membership must have confidence that we are maintaining the standard of excellence expected at the lowest possible cost. We must continue to seek sponsorship; opportunities will likely come with the greater exposure that live streaming offers.

I would encourage every member to try and attend at least one Legion T&F Championship - you will be hooked and even prouder of this great organization.

b. <u>Presentation by Banfield</u>

What is Facebook and Instagram Live?

- A live video broadcast filmed from a smart phone or iPad that streams to your Facebook Page or Instagram profile.
- It has the capabilities to reach a wide audience and lets you directly interact with your audience in a two-way dialogue in real time.

Why Facebook & Instagram Live?

- Cost effective (it's free).
- Facebook Live has the ability to reach a wide audience, increasing awareness of the Legion Nationals.
- Instagram Live reaches those who already follow your Instagram account making them more interested in the Legion Nationals.
- Potential for your audience to directly interact with the live stream (an immersive experience with the Legion Nationals)
 - Allows family members, coaches, and friends, who are not at the Legion Nationals, to watch in real time, feel like they are part of the event and contribute to the excitement through their real-time comments.

What were our goals and objectives?

- 1) Increase awareness of the Legion Nationals by reaching a large audience with high viewership.
- 2) Have an exciting, engaging experience for viewers at home to feel as though they are involved in the competition.
- 3) Cover as many events as possible with only two live feeds.
- 4) Get the athletes involved by directly interacting with them whenever possible.

Results: Facebook Live

- Over three days, the Facebook Live broadcasts received a total 50,686 views with 2,497 comments and 3,623 reactions (i.e. Likes), and 278 video shares.
- The video posts themselves were seen by a total of 176,456 Facebook users.
- On average there were 72 viewers at a time, with the highest number of live views at 140
- Audience feedback was mostly extremely receptive and grateful for the opportunity to

- feel as though they were at the Legion Nationals themselves.
- A lot of comments cheering on the athletes and back and forth engagement between viewers and the camera person.

Results: Instagram Live

- Instagram Live only reaches those who follow the Legion Nationals Instagram Account.
- Without an accurate measurement we calculated roughly 1,000 total live views over the three days with an average 300 comments per day.
- Audience feedback was extremely grateful for the opportunity to feel as though they were at the Legion Nationals themselves, cheering on the athletes.
- A lot of back and forth engagement between viewers and the camera person.

Outcomes

- 1) More exposure and more awareness of the Legion Nationals and what the competition is all about.
- 2) A surge in audience/fan growth on the two social media platforms.
- 3) Potential to now communicate with more of your target audience.
- 4) Engaged athletes, coaches, friends and family with a positive experience results in the potential for them to become Legion Nationals Ambassadors by spreading the news and sharing their own Legion Nationals experiences. This helps keep popularity high and grow even further.

Lessons Learned

- Have multiple feeds covering as many events as possible three would be ideal.
- Pushing the limits of technology.
 - Reliable tech support and on the field help (the ability to swap iPads, battery packs, chargers or making sure there are spares, charged and ready to go whenever they are needed).
 - o Promoting the live broadcast beforehand helped with high viewership.
 - Maintain engagement with your audience on the different social media channels after the competition is over – keep Legion Nationals front of mind.

- **b. Sponsorship** Home Hardware will continue its \$20,000 sponsorship for 2018. MBNA will again be solicited for sponsorship funding as will an assortment of Canadian companies including BMO. To this point the sponsorship solicitation program, which has been in effect for four years, has had limited success.
- **c.** Remembrance Theme The selected remembrance theme for 2018 is the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. An accompanying theme will be Peacekeepers Day (9 August).
- **d.** <u>Invitees</u> The Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba will be invited to attend as the opening guest of honour. The invitation for a closing guest of honour is still in the planning stages.

- **e.** <u>Event Assistant</u> Due to the Ontario college strike, interviews for the event assistant have been delayed. They will now be conducted during the first week of December and a student with the Algonquin College School of Sports Business Management will be selected for 2018. The selected intern will begin the internship with the Legion during the first full week of January 2018.
- **g.** <u>Head Chaperones</u> Both Helen and John Ladouceur have indicated their willingness to return as Head Chaperones. It is requested that authorization be given to accept their offer.

MOTION: It was moved that Helen and John Ladouceur be selected as the Head Chaperones for 2018.

Flight group bookings have been made for all provincial teams through WestJet.

d. Athletics Canada

An Athletics Canada partnership meeting took place on March 1, 2018 with Bill MacMackin, Board of Directors Chair, Rob Guy, Chief Executive Officer, and Mathieu Gentès, Chief Operating Officer. Athletics Canada would like to enhance the relationship with the Royal Canadian Legion Dominion Command for the 2018 Legion Nationals.

7. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

a. Eight Ball

The following suggestions were received from members and discussed by the Sports Committee at past meetings:

- Automatic berth for host branch the host branch should be given a one team entry automatically which would not require provincial qualifications. This would have multiple benefits:
 - 1. Would add one team which would make for more play.
 - 2. Would encourage branches to host.
 - 3. Would help garner community support knowing a local team was playing in the National Championship.
 - 4. Would bring local spectators into the branch to watch the matches.

This recommendation will be presented for DEC consideration.

ii. Select players for divisions by random draw to prevent teams from trying to manipulate the roster.

This recommendation will be presented for DEC consideration.

iii. Allow the Dominion Representative to set the number of games per match. As the number of teams decrease, the number of matches decrease exponentially. Two games per match would allow each player to have the opportunity to break.

Following additional review and discussion, it was suggested that the number of games should be determined by Dominion Command prior to the Championships based on the availability of tables, as well as, the number of provincial teams registered.

<u>MOTION:</u> It was moved that the sports committee present the following recommendation to DEC: that the number of games should be determined by Dominion Command prior to the Championships based on the availability of tables, as well as, the number of provincial teams registered.

CARRIED

iv. Consider adopting the Billiard Congress of America Pool Leagues (BCAPL) rules instead of the World Pool-Billiards Association (WPA) rules.

As the Canadian Billiards & Snooker Association (CBSA) is the governing body of Cue Sports for Canada, the Royal Canadian Legion Dominion Command has deferred to them for their input which is as follows:

There is always a bit of confusion surrounding the difference between the WPA's rules and those used in BCA Pool Leagues (BCAPL). In fact, even the BCA uses the WPA rule set for non-league events.

I would certainly recommend the WPA rules to align with the national and international standard, but you will almost inevitably run into a situation where players used to playing under BCAPL rules might require an explanation. Specifically on the issue of cue ball fouls or fouls on any ball, the full WPA readout is as follows:

6.6 Touched Ball

It is a foul to touch, move or change the path of any object ball except by the normal ball-to-ball contacts during shots. It is a foul to touch, move or change the path of the cue ball except when it is in hand or by the normal tip-to-ball forward stroke contact of a shot. The shooter is responsible for the equipment he controls at the table, such as chalk, bridges, clothing, his hair, parts of his body, and the cue ball when it is in hand, that may be involved in such fouls.

This is basically saying that you can't touch the cue ball, and you can't move any object balls. The way this usually plays out is if a player comes in contact an object ball whilst cueing, the players or referee will determine whether or not the object ball has moved and if so, it is ruled a foul. Any contact with the cue ball other than with the tip of the cue is a foul.

In the WPA rules, a scratch on the break in 8-Ball results in the opposing player taking the cue ball behind the headstring, not anywhere on the table as in BCAPL rules.

<u>ACTION:</u> Dominion Sports Committee Secretary to send out the Eight Ball rules as a friendly reminder prior to the Championships.

As previously discussed, there has been support of affiliating Dominion Sports with a governing body (i.e. Canadian Billiards & Snooker Association, American Cribbage

Congress, and National Darts Federation of Canada). This is perceived to be of some value in that the exposure of the Legion would be broadened by introducing Legion programs to those who know little about the Legion. In addition, the affiliation could allow Legion teams to be qualified to compete at the highest level.

For example, the Canadian Billiards & Snooker Association (CBSA) is proposing an affiliation between our two organizations. They would like to put a link to the Legion website with logo and a description of the Legion organization on their website and the Legion would reciprocate by doing the same for CBSA. It is assumed that this exchange of information would serve both organizations well, allowing their members the ability to find Legion locations and information while Legion members could find information on pool and snooker all across Canada. They would also like to offer the Legion an option of having spots allocated to Legion members to attend the CBSA 8 Ball Amateur Championships or the CBSA 8 Ball Open Championships.

c. <u>Track & Field Championships Selection Process and PSO Relationships</u>

In order to enhance event promotion and awareness, a better understanding of current selection processes and PSO relationships is required. The Dominion Sports Committee Secretary requested that all Provincial Command Sports Representatives submit their selection criteria to Dominion Command.

d. Track & Field Championships Provincial Chairs Meeting

As many Provincial Commands send their Track and Field chairs to the Legion Nationals, it has been suggested to schedule a formal meeting. There is little consistency with coaches and chaperones year to year so the provincial chair could be the stabilizing factor. The meeting would provide chairs with the opportunity to share knowledge, discuss best practices and onboard new provincial chairs as required. A conference call line would be open for those who are unable to attend in person.

<u>ACTION:</u> Dominion Sports Committee to select a time during the 2018 Legion Nationals for a Provincial Sports Chairs Meeting.

8. **NEW BUSINESS**

As introduced at item 3:

a. 2018 Dominion Member Sports Championships Airline Costs

Request was made that the Dominion Sports Committee Secretary assists with airline bookings to ensure the lowest cost is found.

b. Future of Dominion Eight Ball Championships

With 7 of 10 Provincial Commands competing in eight ball, the future of the sport to be determined by the membership at Convention. Legion Member Sports generates revenue at the branch level and promotes comradeship and sportsmanship.

c. <u>Medal Presenters at the Legion National Youth Track & Field</u> <u>Championships</u>

It is important to reinforce the image of the Royal Canadian Legion during medal presentations. All Legion members presenting medals must be in Legion Dress.

d. <u>DEC Meeting and Dominion Cribbage Championships Conflicting Dates</u>

It was reminded to ensure that the Dominion Member Sports Championship dates are taken into consideration when scheduling DEC Meetings as the Championships are set years in advance and there are some members who serve on both DEC and Sports Committee.

e. <u>2021 & 2022 Legion National Youth Track & Field Championships Dates</u>

The Legion National Youth Track & Field Championships will be held in the following timeframes:

- 2021: 4-10 August 2021 (competition dates: 6-8 August)
- 2022: 3-9 August 2022 (competition dates: 5-7 August)

Some municipalities have expressed interest in hosting and it was explained that centralization is not required as bids will be selected based on their merits.

9. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned Tuesday, March 6, 2018 at 1400 hours.

My only other comment is about having a set break of thirty minutes for lunch so that all players can eat a proper meal.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone involved in the 2018 Dominion Cribbage Tournament for the warm hospitality and the comradeship. It was a pleasure to work with everyone and to have a weekend that was enjoyed by all.

2018 DOMINION CRIBBAGE TOURNAMENT AFTER ACTION REPORT

The work involved in planning and fundraising for a 4 day event is fairly significant with lots of logistics and fundraising to be worked out. Although our event went extremely well, the organizing committee would like to submit the following observations that will hopefully help future venues when hosting.

Receiving the Information Package Earlier

We received confirmation of approval to host this event via email on November 30, 2016. Upon contacting Command to see what was expected from the host venue we were told that a complete package would be forwarded to us in the fall. We received the email containing subject directions/information on Friday, October 27, 2017. Although that was 6 months prior to the event we found that some timelines were rushed – especially in gathering, drafting, getting approval and printing of the Souvenir booklet. It takes time to get letters out and responses back from local dignitaries (especially the Premier's office) requesting a Welcome Message and or inviting them to attend the event and what role they would be expected to play (speeches, etc).

Provincial playoffs should be completed sooner.

Suggest provincial playdowns be completed no later than end of February. One province didn't finish their playdowns until 3 weeks prior to the event which caused us some issues with the block booking of rooms we had arranged. Also, having the names of players earlier would help with getting name tags printed, prepare the page for the souvenir booklet, set up playing schedules, etc. This would also allow more time for Dominion Command to book flights and not be rushed and allow time for participants to fundraise to offset travel if required.

Singles and Doubles Play should run consecutively not as individual events

According to the rules players have maximum of 30 mins per set of 2 games. The rules state that breaks and lunch breaks are not to be scheduled during play. This made for a very long day for players (especially the one person who was playing in both events). Players arriving later in the day on Friday would also be tired and jet-lagged.

Opening ceremonies/rule revision was at 0900 with play for singles starting at 9:30. This meant players who wanted to have breakfast prior to commencement of events needed to be picked up at the hotel starting at 0800 hrs and would not have a break until play was completed approx. 5 hours after starting play. (Singles - first game started at 0930 and last game was completed at approx. 1420 hrs. Doubles started at 1430 and ended at approx. 1910 hrs).

If singles and doubles were run consecutively it would allow for a later start time, small breaks between games for those who need to use the washroom, get water, have a smoke or just simply stretch their legs and it would also for a 30 - 45 min break for lunch. Play would then potentially finish around 16:30 hrs. Players could then have a bit of time to relax before dinner being served around 5 - 5:30.

Standardized Forms for play

We recommend that the information package also contain templates for scoring that LACs can use to ensure forms used during play are consistent at all future tournaments. (Copies of what we used can be provided upon request)

Also, if forms were to include the teams scores at the end of each game, (with the exception being ties for 1st which would need the required play off) it would make it easier to show placement of teams at the end of the day (ie: if there was a tie for 5th & 6th placement of who is listed as 5th place and who was 6th would be determined by total point standings).

Hopefully this feedback will be helpful in the planning of future events.

In closing, my committee is very pleased to continue to hear such positive and great feedback about our venue, the volunteers and the overall running of this year's event. It was a lot of work but well worth the end result!
