President Connor Weed said one of the mandates of the Legion is provide for veterans who are in need. The scooter was purchased out of the poppy fund. Willis is appreciative of receiving the scooter. At one time, he was taking his dog for a walk three times a day, now he can barely take his dog for a walk once a day. The new scooter will increase his independence.

Willis served with the Canadian Navy from 1963 to 1966. His most memorable experience happened when he was aboard the HMCS Kootenay and chased a Soviet submarine across the Atlantic Ocean in the midst of the Cold War.

The local legion started its campaign for a new physical location with a bang, at its duelling pianos fundraiser, January 28, at Blackjacks Roadhouse. The Royal Canadian Legion Leduc Branch 108 raised \$15,200 at the event. "This was our first big capital fundraiser for a new place, as there is no physical Legion in Leduc right now. We are happy with how this one went, and are hoping to hold another one at Blackjacks in September," said Branch 108 board member Cindy Miller. This year's event raised money through admission, a live auction, a silent auction, and two 50-50 raffles. Duelling piano performers were brought in from Edmonton, and were a huge hit. Though the auctions were successful, Miller is hopeful that with a longer runway to plan, the next event will feature even more items, and raise even more funds. The event was sold out.
